

## NRMA Safer Driving School Road Safety Grants 2011

### Frequently Asked Questions

1. **Who can apply?** Only government and not-for-profit organisations can apply. Examples of such organisations include community groups, schools and preschools, local government organisations etc.
2. **How does my organisation apply?** All submissions must be completed on the online booking form which will be available 25 July 2011. Submissions must address the specific criteria that appear on the online booking form and will not be accepted in any other form. You can register below to be kept up-to-date when new information is available.
3. **Can my organisation apply for more than one grant?** Yes, your organisation may apply for more than one grant for different projects and educational activities.
4. **Can my organisation apply for funding for an existing road safety education program?** Yes, however priority may be given to new initiatives who have not previously received funding.
5. **Can my school use part of the funds for release from face-to-face teaching to develop curriculum material?** Schools may apply for some part of the funding to cover the cost of release from face-to-face teaching to allow time for program development.
6. **What are the judges looking for?** The judges will be looking for interesting and innovative initiatives which educate the community about road safety. These initiatives should provide evidence of a local road safety need as well as a solution. Programs with strong community engagement will be seen more favourably by the judges. Submissions where large proportions of the funding are dedicated to venue hire, catering and advertising costs will be seen as less favourable as this could suggest a lack of strong community support.
7. **Are there any activities that will not be considered for funding?** Submissions that involve any of the following will not be eligible for a Grant, and will be disqualified:
  - learner driver instruction fees or sessions and defensive driver training;
  - salary costs or administration costs to manage the development or delivery of the program excluding fees to cover the cost of presenters;
  - IT equipment and/or hardware unless that equipment can be clearly seen to be a necessary part of a new and integrated road safety education program which has been developed as part of the Submission; and
  - delivery of community programs already being offered by NRMA.
