Conduct of the AGM

Under the Corporations Act 2001, the Directors are required to lay before the meeting the Financial Report, Directors' Report and Auditor's Report for the financial year ended 30 June 2020. No resolution is required for this item of ordinary business. The Chair will give Members a reasonable opportunity to ask questions about, or make comments on, the business of the AGM or the management of the NRMA.

The Auditor will be in attendance to address Members' questions about the conduct of the audit, the Auditor's Report, the accounting policies adopted by the NRMA in relation to the preparation of the Financial Report and the independence of the Auditor in relation to the conduct of the audit.

The Chair will exercise their powers as the chair of the meeting to ensure it is conducted in an orderly, courteous and timely fashion, in the interests of Members.

Appointment of Proxy

A Member who is entitled to attend and vote at the AGM has the right to appoint a proxy to attend and vote on their behalf. A proxy need not be a Member and may be an individual or a body corporate.

As there are no resolutions for Members to vote on at the AGM, a proxy form has not been provided. However, if you wish to appoint a proxy you can do so:
